114. Apologies for absence – Apologies were received and accepted for J Blandford and N Bullock. Councillor G Baker absent.

115. To receive Declarations of Interest

No declarations of interest were received at this point in the meeting.

116. Public Participation

Residents gave their opinions on the two planning applications on this agenda and asked that the Council consider the criteria contained in the emerging NDP in their deliberations. One resident also asked that the correct procedure be used for the casual vacancy on the Parish Council.

117. Minutes

The minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on the 14th February 2018 were approved as a correct record of that meeting and signed by the Chairman.

118. Ward Member Report

Councillor Durkin presented his report, previously circulated by email, with the main points being: Councillor Jonathan Lester has been elected the new Leader of Herefordshire Council, Pothole repair funding for Herefordshire of 1.25 million from central government, Hereford County Hospital - Demolition of 1930s hutted wards moves a step closer.

119. Neighbourhood Plan

The Chairman of the Neighbourhood Development Plan Working Party Informed Councillors that the Much Marcle NDP was ready to be submitted to the independent examiner. The Clerk Informed Council that she had received the list of proposed examiners, with a choice of three. It was proposed that the Neighbourhood Plan Working Group look at the list and inform Councillors of their preferred choice.

120. General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR)

Proposed residential development of 8 dwellings is not supported by the emerging Much Marcle NDP, 50% outside the Settlement Boundary in open countryside, the layout and size of the development not sustainable with the Character and local environment of the area (Policies LD2, LD3, H2 and RA3), Within a conservation area, Impact on 2 important landscapes referred to in the draft NDP

The proposed 8 dwellings are contrary to the wishes expressed by the local community and does not address local housing needs nor offer

any social or affordable housing.
