2. Ward Members report

Councillor Mike Barber-Starkey presented his report on the activities of the Parish Council during the year 2018-2019 with the main points being:

The plan to make more of the Annual Parish meeting by inviting other local organisations and groups to be involve and give a report to the Parishioners.

The NDP successful referendum and now forms part of the Parish Council decision making process for planning. A vote of thanks to Councillor T Weston for his contribution.

The Footpath Officer, who has made excellent progress with the Parish Footpaths and Rights of Way, now has a group of very active volunteers, forming the Footpath Working Group, to help him with walking the footpaths and repairs as necessary. The speed limit on the A449 is still an issue that the Parish Council will continue to work at for a reduction.

The casual vacancy in 2018 saw Councillor A Hope elected onto the Parish Council with the turnout to vote of 32%.

The Parish Council arranged a well-attended Parish Litter Pick in October, a pity the weather wasn't kind. This is hoped to be a bi-annual event using our own kits donated by Balfour Beatty.

Eleven candidates stood for election to fill nine places. There was a 46% turnout to vote, which was an excellent ratio for the County

A vote of thanks to Councillor Barry Durkin for all his efforts in representing the Parrish as the Old Gore Ward Member.
