The Safer Roads Partnership is strengthening its speed enforcement activity on the A4110

The adoption of the enforcement route is in direct response to the number of collisions along the A4110. From 1 January 2014 to end of December 2016 there have been 39 injury collisions along A4110 in Herefordshire.

Herefordshire Council is seeking an order from local magistrates to require a local householder to remove a private wall

Herefordshire Council is seeking an order from local magistrates to require a local householder to remove a private wall, where safety concerns regarding the poor condition of the wall has forced the closure of a road in Symonds Yat. The council is appealing for a section 77 notice under the Building Act 1984, to require the owner of the property, next to the C1257 road, to remove a wall erected without consent.

Second emergency closure order issued within a week to crack down on illegal tobacco in Hereford

A three month emergency closure order has been granted against International Food at 10 Commercial Road, Hereford. A contested hearing was held yesterday morning (Monday 15 October) at Hereford Magistrates' Court due to the persistent sale of illegal tobacco at the store.

Hereford Magistrates' Court granted the closure order following West Mercia Police serving the premises with a 48 hour closure notice on Monday 8 October under the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. The court heard that International Food had persistently sold illegal tobacco for the last eight years despite numerous raids and prosecutions.

This closure order follows a notice granted against Zabka on Eign Gate, Hereford recently. Only a handful of police forces and local authorities have used this new power, which was considered appropriate and proportionate due to the persistent disregard to previous

regulatory action. Breaching a closure order is a criminal offence, and anyone that attempts to access the address could be arrested.
