Broadband is a challenge for parts of my parishes and while the County now has 90% of all premises with superfast broadband including most of my villages the remaining 10% left is in the rural areas. The Gigaclear contract which was supporting the incorporation of another 30,000 Herefordshire premises is underway as are the contractor of Airband. However there remains many challenges with the contractors and while 97% coverage is the projected aim by 2021 I remain to be convinced on delivery timetable. Veteran Support Centre Opens in Herefordshire

Herefordshire's Veteran Support Centre (VSC) opened its doors on Monday 11th November, ahead of an official launch in the New Year. Located in the city centre, it offers a friendly one-stop shop for anyone in the armed forces community needing guidance, with flexible and accessible spaces for meetings and group workshops, along with employment and volunteering opportunities. The VSC has been established thanks to a successful grant application by Herefordshire Council to the Ministry of Defence to pilot a veteran hub project. Herefordshire's Armed Forces Covenant Partnership will continue to oversee the centre for the next year whilst a new team of trustees forms and achieves its own independent charitable status.

WARNING FROM THE POLICE ABOUT TELEPHONE SCAMS

62% of courier fraud victims were aged 75 - 89

Recently, there has been an increase in courier fraud offences, in particular in Herefordshire and Worcestershire. These despicable crimes mostly impact upon vulnerable people within our communities, who are often convinced to hand over large amounts of money or expensive items such as designer watches.

What tends to happen is that the victim is 'cold-called' by the criminal who falsely claims to be a Police Officer, saying that there has been fraudulent use of their bank card/account. They are advised that they need to withdraw large sums of money from their bank to protect it, and then return home. They are told that a "Police Officer" will come round and collect the money to keep it safe.

Often they are advised to ring 999 to report to the local police. The line is kept open and a different offender will persuade them to withdraw their money ready for collection.

 \succ If you are suspicious or feel uncomfortable with the caller's questions, end the call.

➢ If in doubt hang up, wait 10 minutes, then report the call to Action Fraud on 0300 1232040.

> Report it to the police 101 if the crime is still happening and the suspect is in the local area, or if you are vulnerable and/or unable to contact Action Fraud,

- Phone and ask you for your full PIN or full banking password
- Ask you to transfer money out of your account
- Ask you to hand over any money or purchase vouchers

Livestock farmer pleaded guilty to allowing animals to suffer

In a case brought by Herefordshire Council's Trading Standards service a livestock farmer in Bringsty pleaded guilty to ten charges in total and was disqualified from keeping all animals for ten years (except his dog) after allowing livestock to suffer (including 50 calves) and for failing to correctly store and dispose of large amounts of animal carcasses. He was sentenced on 11 November 2019 at Hereford Magistrates' Court to four months imprisonment suspended for 18 months, 200 hours community service, a victim surcharge of £115 and costs of £2221.
